BRAINARD AIRPORT

Hartford, Connecticut

OVERVIEW

Brainard Airport has significance as one of Connecticut's oldest airports. Early aviators such as Charles Lindbergh and Lieutenant Stuart Chadwick (the first person to land at the airport) are associated with the site. As Hartford's only airport, Brainard is an important part of the social and economic history of the area.

Located in the southeast section of Hartford, east of Interstate 91, Brainard Airport was built by the city and opened on June 11, 1921. It was constructed in response to an accident in which two men were killed as they tried to land their plane in Goodwin Park. In 1927 Charles Lindbergh landed at Brainard, which was his first stop on a major tour after his cross-Atlantic flight. In 1952 the City of Hartford divided the property, and the state purchased that portion currently occupied by the airport. Buildings which date from the 1930s are a hangar, the headquarters building, and an Air National Guard office and hangar.
